

Did you know . . . The first school house (now part of where the education wing is) was 32' x 48', two stories plus basement. Cost of construction \$2,882.57. The lot cost \$400.00. The building was dedicated in 1885. Later that year a well was dug as water had to be "borrowed" from the neighbors. The fire escape was added in 1937. Sunday School classes were added in the early 1900s. The top floor was also used for meals, council meetings, church suppers and receptions.

CONGREGATIONAL COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

Immanuel Evangelical Lutheran Church Tuesday, May 16, 2023 at 6:00pm Location: Youth Room

Present: Brian Konz, Bob Boxell, Andrew Woodard, Sue Weihert, Ruth Mack, Sue Putra, DeWayne

Roberson, Pr Carina Schiltz

Absent: Emily Lessner, Katie Bartelt, Ryan Lessner

The meeting was called to order by President Roberson at 6:04 p.m.

Opening Devotion: Pastor Carina shared 2 heartfelt thank you notes: Evelyn Agar-Pratt, Rita Argus.

The agenda was amended to move Dave Morstad's presentation to earlier on the agenda. The revised agenda was approved.

Vision Victories were shared including Mother's Day, Rachels Day, litany, coffee hours, 160 postcards signed and ready to mail

Resource Library Project: David Morstad appeared before the council to discuss a potential resource library project.

This falls under the Faith Formation committee. Presently 2 rooms exist, a library room, and a room across the hall which previously was furnished with couch/chair. The proposal is to repurpose the space to support family and education ministries. The materials now housed include many outdated books, etc.

Mr. Morstad shared a draft of a survey to be sent to the congregation. The survey includes questions regarding respondent's demographics, knowledge/use of library space as well as an opportunity to prioritize potential uses of the space. Potential uses include, but are not limited to: computer/internet access, children's materials, prayer/meditation materials, inclusion resources, take-home activities for families, parenting resources, faith-based resources, book exchange, conversation space.

There is no money currently budgeted for this project. Planning will require a substantial time commitment and must be mindful of congregational needs. Presently there is no air or heat in the space.

The council voiced support for the survey; Mr. Morstad was given permission to proceed with the survey process.

Approval of Minutes: The approval of April meeting minutes is deferred until the June meeting.

Financial Report: The April financial reports were accepted as printed. Motion: Sue Weihert, Second: Brian Konz Motion carried.

Membership Report: The May membership report was accepted. Motion: Ruth Mack second: Andrew Woodard

Pastor's report: A written report was received by council via email prior to the meeting. The council voiced recognition and approval of Pastor Carina's efforts.

Committee Reports: The Worship and Music, and the Mission and Outreach reports were accepted. Motion: Sue Weihert, Second: Ruth Mack Motion carried. Matt Stein was recognized as going "above and beyond" playing for community events, including services at The Grove.

Old Business:

Restroom rails: The bid was accepted (\$2920) and the work is to be completed within 60 days by Maas Brothers. Four stalls will receive the installation of code-required bars.

Police Dept. walk through: Pastor Carina, DeWayne Roberson and Mark Putra participated. Recommendations include: Nightlocks®, 3M® Bulletproof security film, "Greeters" at unsecured doors, Unsupervised areas need attention, Security cameras (present cameras inoperable, WELCA may be interested in assisting.)

2022 Audit report: prepared by Kelly Braunschweig. Will be sent to two others for approval.

Staff Evaluations: Brian Konz met with one employee and will provide a written summary. Additional employees will be evaluated in near future.

Listening Report: A written report is not completed as of yet.

New Business:

An open position on the Cemetery Committee exists due to the resignation of Rick Schuett. Rick is recognized for his service.

After discussion, Brian Konz is appointed by council to fill this position, until the next election to be held at the annual meeting. Mr. Konz indicated he would assist the committee in writing policies and procedures, aligned with those of the Endowment Fund. The Constitution dictates the committee will consist of Pastor, and minimum of 3 congregation members. Wanda Udovich and Dennis Daley presently serve on the committee.

Report from Properties meeting (05/11/2023): An open meeting was held, inviting all interested members to attend. Seven people attended.

Due to the aging of those who serve, council will pursue younger individuals with appropriate skills to join the committee. (this action is recommended by those currently serving in positions involved in maintaining properties.)

Those in attendance were asked to prioritize property concerns, albeit non-binding. A written maintenance schedule topped the list, followed by (in no particular order) restroom rails, snow/lawn concerns, security plan, fire protection plan, boiler issue, sanctuary roof, parking lot repair, solar power.

It was suggested the committee schedule regular meetings for the future. There is no limit in the size of the committee: interested members are welcome.

FEMA Webinar report: President Roberson participated in a FEMA webinar concerning federal grants up to \$50,000 available to non-profit entities for security purposes. The grants are competitive; written grants are first submitted to State of Wisconsin for review. The State forwards approved grants to the federal level, and FEMA approves/denies. The grant monies can be used for safety training, as well as for supplies such as window film, etc. Mark Putra has expressed interest in helping with the grant writing.

Parish Protection Plan: Pastor Carina reviewed the draft of the protection plan. The draft is a compilation of information from the South Central Synod of Wisconsin, the county governments and the school system. The council supported the plan, deeming it very thorough. Pastor Carina indicated areas of the plan still require further refinement.

Thrivent Annuity/Mission Investment accounts: Two accounts currently exist which are earning minimal returns.

Andrew Woodward reviewed the accounts, indicating the Thrivent Annuity has a value of \$49,687 and the Mission Investment is valued at \$8219.36. The finance committee is recommending the accounts be closed.

A motion was made to close out the Thrivent Annuity and Mission Investment accounts for the values determined at the time of the processing and to transfer the collected funds to the building loan at the State Bank of Reeseville. Motion: Andrew Woodard Second: Ruth Mack. Motion carried. These funds will reduce the amount of the mortgage to be secured next year.

PASTOR HAS THE LAST WORD!

Hello, disciples of Jesus Christ at Immanuel:

My husband Eric and I walk every day together if we can. Often he'll say something like, "The year is (a quarter/half/three-quarters) over!" And we will talk about what we have experienced so far this year. When I think about that in terms of Immanuel's life together, I'm very encouraged. Look at the adventures God calls us to!
